

ANNEX TO THE GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

POLAND

The following annex is part of the general terms and conditions that govern all online offers, sales and purchases through the website(s) currently located at <https://kronaby.com> (together with any successor site(s), the "Site").

1 DEFINITIONS

1.1 The following terms and expressions shall have the following meaning:

- a. **WEEE Directive:** means Directive 2012/19/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 4 July 2012 on waste electrical and electronic equipment;
- b. **WEEE or waste electrical and electronic equipment:** means waste electrical or electronic equipment as defined in article 3 (1)(e), being "waste within the meaning of Article 3(1) of Directive 2008/98/EC, including all components, sub-assemblies and consumables which are part of the product at the time of discarding"; as implemented under Polish law in Article 4 point 24) of the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act;
- c. **EEE or electrical and electronic equipment:** means electrical or electronic equipment as defined in article 3 (1)(a) of the WEEE Directive, being " equipment which is dependent on electric currents or electromagnetic fields in order to work properly and equipment for the generation, transfer and measurement of such currents and fields and designed for use with a voltage rating not exceeding 1 000 volts for alternating current and 1 500 volts for direct current" ; as implemented under Polish law in Article 4 point 13) of the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act;
- d. **Household WEEE:** means WEEE from private households as defined in Article 3(1)(h) of the WEEE Directive being "the WEEE from private households and the WEEE which comes from commercial, industrial, institutional and other sources which, because of its nature and quantity, is similar to that from private households. Waste from EEE likely to be used by both private households and users other than private households shall in any event be considered to be WEEE from private households; are qualified as professional WEEE the other WEEE", as implemented under Polish law in Article 4 point 25) of the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act;
- e. **Producer:** means any natural or legal person as defined in article 3 (1)(f) of the WEEE Di-

rective and as implemented under Polish law in Article 4 point 11) of the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act, i.e. the ML Client;

- f. **Distributor:** means any natural or legal person as defined in article 3 (1)(g) of the WEEE Directive, being: "any natural or legal person in the supply chain, who makes an EEE available on the market" and as implemented under Polish law in Article 4 point 2) of the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act, i.e. the ML Client; Distributor may be at the same time an entity placing the equipment on the market;
- g. **Entity placing the equipment on the market:** means a natural person, an organizational unit without legal personality or a legal person that, regardless of the used sales technique, including means of remote communication:
 - a) has its registered seat within the territory of Poland and manufactures the equipment under its own name or trade mark or places equipment designed or manufactured specifically for it under its own name or trade mark on the territory of Poland,
 - b) has its registered seat within the territory of Poland and resells on the territory of Poland, under its own name or trade mark, equipment manufactured by other entities; the reseller is not considered as an entity placing the equipment on the market if the equipment bears the name or the trade mark of an entity placing the equipment on the market, or
 - c) has its registered seat within the territory of Poland and places on the market equipment from a member state other than Poland or a state not being a member state, provided that as an entity placing the equipment on the market is not regarded an entity that performs funding on an exclusive basis as part of or according to a financial agreement, unless such entity acts at the same time as the an entity placing the equipment on the market; which definition is included under Article 4 point 20) of the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act.
- h. Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act means the Polish act of 11 September 2015 (Journal of Law 2015, no. 1688, as amended) implementing to Polish legal system provisions of WEEE Directive.

2 SCOPE OF INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS

2.1 The information set out below applies to EEE as follows:

- a. from 1 January 2016 to 30 December 2017 to EEE falling within the categories set out in Annex I of the WEEE Directive. Annex II of the WEEE Directive contains an indicative list

of EEE which falls within the categories set out in Annex I. This includes amongst others:

- Large household appliances
 - Small household appliances
 - IT and telecommunications equipment
 - Consumer equipment and photovoltaic panels
 - Lighting equipment
 - Electrical and electronic tools, with the exception of large-scale stationary industrial tools
 - Toys, leisure and sports equipment
 - Medical devices, with the exception of all implanted and infected medical devices
 - Monitoring and control instruments
 - Automatic dispensers
- b. from 1 January 2018 to all EEE, unless excluded in article 2 (3) of the WEEE Directive.

3 INFORMATION FOR USER OF THE EEE

- 3.1 According to the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act, the following information needs to be provided to users of the EEE:
- a. the requirement not to dispose of WEEE as unsorted municipal waste and to collect such WEEE separately;
 - b. the return and collection systems available to users, encouraging the coordination of information on the available collection points irrespective of the producers or other operators which have set them up;
 - c. the role of the user in contributing to re-use, recycling and other forms of recovery of WEEE;
 - d. the potential effects on the environment and human health as a result of the presence of hazardous substances in EEE;
 - e. the possibilities for re-use, repair, recycling and other forms of recovery of WEEE;
 - f. the crossed-out wheeled bin symbol and it's meaning:



- 3.2 According to Article 16 of the Polish Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act, the entities introducing equipment on the market and the Distributors of EEE are required to provide information on the cost corresponding to the take back and recycling of EEE they put on the market. The costs of waste management cannot exceed the costs actually incurred for this purpose.
